- General Playing Field Maintenance.
- Gameday Field Preparation and In-game Field Maintenance.

START DATE

HOURS

Full time. Non-game day: 8:00 AM-4:00 PM, Game days: 8:00 AM through end of the game/event. Times may vary. Expect to work weekends and special events.

Must be pursuing a degree in Turf Management or related field of study.
